

Western Dressed

June 6–10, 2011

Dr. Laurel Wilson, professor of textiles and apparel at the University of Missouri along with Buffalo Bill Historical staff will lead students in an investigation of western dress and cowboy culture through lecture, tours, and artifact study. Topics include the American Indian, Hispanic, and fur trade origins of dressing western, cowboy dress, the role of Buffalo Bill's Wild West, film, dude ranching, and rodeo. All of these influences collectively create a western style that is familiar today.

This seminar is in conjunction with the exhibition *Dressed Just Right: An Evolution of Western Style from Function to Flamboyance* on display at the Buffalo Bill Historical Center from June 4 – October 3, 2011.
