Carving a Memory: Sculpting With Artist J. Burnham Rudolph

While taking in one of J. Burnham Rudolph’s sculptures, an emotion, a spirit, or a feeling is sure to come over you—an experience this artist counts on. No matter the subject, Rudolph wants the observer to relate to what he sees. In this very personal sculpting workshop, follow Rudolph’s direction and vision in carving your own 4 x 2 inch clay buffalo. Take home your creation, your tools, and a copy of Rudolph’s white resin cast to practice your newly-learned skill at home.

Day Tripping: Hike up the Nature Conservancy’s Heart Mountain

Become a photo journalist as you hike up Heart Mountain (elevation 8,123 feet), a few miles northeast of the town of Cody. With guidance from our interpretive specialist, explore the plants, wildlife, and unique geology along the trail. Come prepared for this “moderately-strenuous” hike with proper footwear, clothing, and water, and don’t forget your camera! The fee for this true Wyoming experience includes a Saddlebag Lunch, a *Wildflowers of Yellowstone Guide*, transportation, and interpretation.
